

Can you use the internet safely to research the Stone Age?
How did people survive?
Where did they live? What did they eat? What did they wear?

You could record it:
-as if you have interviewed a Stone Age person
-as an information leaflet
-in a mind map
-as a poster.

Can you create a game suitable for a KS1 child to teach them about the Stone Age? It may need a set of instructions which they can use to follow the rules. What will your counters be like? Will you include questions for people to answer?

Can you compare the Stone Age to another nowadays?
You could compare:
- homes then and now
-food then and now
-Things people did then and now

You could even interview an imaginary Stone Age person!

Can you create a time line? You could:
- include start and finish dates
-include historic events that happened
-create it on the computer, as a song, or using junk modelling.

Year 3 Learning Log

Our first learning challenge in Year 3 is
“Could you survive in the stone age?”

We will be looking when this era was, what it was like and if we would have liked to live then.



Can you cook or bake a Stone Age themed meal or dish?

If you can, take photos, or even better, bring some in.

Can you evaluate your cooking? What did you like/dislike?

How could you make it even better?

Can you design a Stone Age outfit?
What would it be made from?

Can you present it so the audience is persuaded to buy and wear it?

How much would your item cost in Stone Age shops?

Can you make a replica Stone Age artefact that you could pretend had been found whilst digging in your garden

Can you present your artefact in an imaginative way?

What will it be...?

Can you find out about a famous Stone Age landmark or person?

You could:

- draw a portrait/picture
- write a biography/fact file
- make a powerpoint presentation.
- record a news report or radio programme
