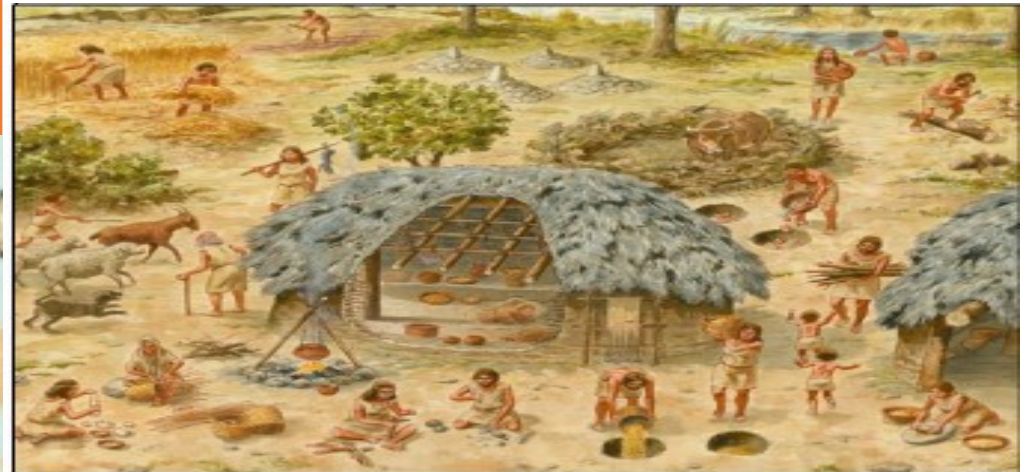

What happened in the Stone/Bronze Age period?



The Stone Age was a time of change and development. Even within the Stone Age period, there was three different periods. Humans started to change and evolve as did their lifestyles. The Bronze Age immediately followed the Stone Age where bronze started to be commonly used in society.



The change and development during the Stone Age period was emphasised through the development of tools as a way of building homes and finding food.

Key Vocabulary

- Palaeolithic period: The Old Stone Age up to 10,000 BCE
- Mesolithic period: Mid Stone Age up to 4000 BCE
- Neolithic period: New Stone Age up to 2300 BCE.
- Artefacts: a man-made object which has cultural and historical significance

Significant People and Places

- Skara Brae: one of the best preserved Neolithic settlements anywhere in Eastern Europe
- Stonehenge: A famous monument probably used for religious and burial ceremonies
