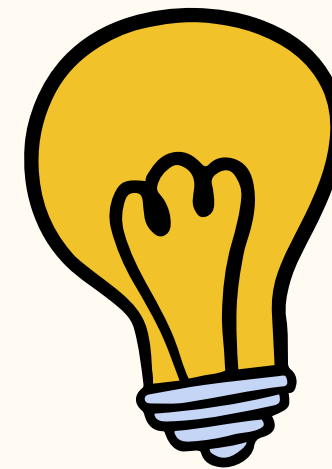


**WELCOME
